May 19 2014 Meeting Minutes. The Bridge Restaurant

The meeting was called to order at 6:40 by President Bernie Stumpf.

No members of the committee were present, but Bernie received an email from Dean asking about perhaps increasing the ticket price to \$7.00 or not offering fresh strawberries. Members present felt the price should remain the same, and more donations should be sought. Jim G offered to help with seeking donations and picking up items.

Stephanie gave a report on the Hangar Party plans. She is interested in booking the band "Sugar" for \$2500.00. They are popular with all ages and have a large following. They are available July 5 or July 11. She was thinking of selling tickets for about \$40.00. Beer, wine, and heavy finger foods would be served. Joyce offered to provide the food at cost. Some members were concerned about serving alcohol at the event which would be open to the general public. Stephanie will research the permits, licenses, and insurance etc.

Stephanie also reported that Dooney's wife will be giving \$5000.00 toward updating the lobby at Dooneys, but perhaps the WAA could still offer something to show our appreciation. A new television was suggested.

Sam W has the Young Eagle Management Procedures written and the WOW manual is almost complete.

Other ideas discussed were; hosting an FAA safety seminar, opening a restaurant at WST, AOPA Fly-in on July 12 in Plymouth. Stephanie says there are pilots at Dooneys who fly-out for breakfast every Sunday, weather permitting. It was suggested these could be posted on the WAA website.
